Airport Nudists

Whether you like it or not, technology is about to make you a nudist. The Parent Television Council and other like-minded groups assert that there's a slippery slope that begins with acceptance of your body and ends in meth-fueled swinger parties.

The Department of Homeland Security is working on a system that will use backscatter X-ray machines in airports. It's already being tested in London's Heathrow Airport. It is an X-ray machine that sees through your clothes, but doesn't penetrate the skin.

"It shows nipples. It shows the clear outline of genitals," privacy advocate Bill Scannell recently told The New York Times.

There is considerable debate about whether the American public will agree to being electronically strip-searched each time they fly. However, the Department of Homeland Security says electronic strip searches are what we need for the "next-level" of security.

Are Koreans Ready For A Nude beach?

A Korean newspaper asks this question about a survey being conducted in Gangwon province this summer to find out whether Korea is ready for its first nude beach, which would be somewhere on the east coast. The move is in step with the recent "well-being" trend, said an official at the East Sea Rim Branch Office under the Gangwon provincial government.

The east coast is known for its fine beaches, and now Gangwon wants to develop a "differentiated" resort where people can swim in the sea and soak up the sun without the encumbrance of swimsuits.

The office said it would survey visitors to east coast beaches from July 10 to August 20 to see if Koreans would want a nude beach like those in France or Australia. Based on the results, the office will begin a search for the right place.

The nude beach would be at a secluded and undeveloped spot, the office said, instead of an existing beach facility. The ages and numbers of visitors would be strictly controlled.

This is not the first time that such an idea has surfaced in Korea. Similar proposals date to the 1990's, but were always rejected by public opinion, which concluded it was too soon.

Eager nudists should be warned, though: For the time being, anyone attempting to go nude on a local beach would be subject to lewd behavior charges.

Nude Statues

Middletown, Connecticut has its own arts scare. A group of nude bronze figures were placed near the senior center, shocking some retirees who have asked that the works be removed. Recently, someone covered the men's "offensive" parts with boxer shorts and a beach towel.

William Vasiliou, president of the housing authority says that permission was never sought to place the sculptures on the lawn near the senior center.

Plans call for placing more than 30 pieces along Middletown's Main Street. A number can be found in front of KidCity, the Middletown Press, Liberty Bank, the Inn at Middletown, the Church of the Holy Trinity, and other businesses.

The man behind the project is William Bendig. In a prepared statement, he said he hopes these sculptures by nationally known artists will transform the city into a "living museum." They are to be in place for two years.

One senior said of the sculptures, "They're disgusting. They should not be here. The sculptor should be deeply ashamed of himself. Children should not see these kinds of things."

A meeting with the mayor has been called for June 21 at the senior center where the public can voice its sentiments.

Gough Begins Second Nude Hike

He's at it again, only this time Stephen Gough, 46, has company for a second attempt to walk the length of Britain in the nude. Accompanying Gough will be his girlfriend Melanie Roberts, 33, of Bournemouth, Dorset, and a librarian from Kent, who does not want to be named..

Gough was arrested 14 times and served two jail sentences when he walked without his clothes from Land's End to John O'Groats in 2003-04.

The former Royal Marine will again set off from Britain's most southwesterly point on the 874 mile trip in order to "celebrate being human."

Mr. Gough said public attitudes to nudity had moved on since his first walk, but admitted he and his companions could still be arrested. He noted that, "Before even setting off this time there has been a lot of publicity so people are going to know it is happening.

Mr. Gough estimates the hike will take two months if he and his fellow hikers are not arrested. He would like it to become an annual event. "Hopefully with this one those people teetering on the edge wanting to join me will come forward."

A Devon and Cornwall Police spokeswoman said the force was waiting for advice from the Crown Prosecution Service on whether to take action against Mr. Gough and his fellow hikers.

[Last year Mr. Gough received a lot of attention nationwide and mixed opinions in the British nudist community. Whether the daring acts of a classic British eccentric will have positive benefits for acceptance of public nudity waits to be seen. I for one, wish the three of them well. -Ed.]

Two Ban The Nude Art Stories

The North Adams, Vermont City Council will review an ordinance proposed by Councilor Robert Moulton Jr. "on moral grounds." It would prohibit displays of nude artwork in downtown shops, galleries, sidewalks and public places.

Moulton said he decided to suggest the ordinance after spotting a nude female sketch hanging in a window display at Gallery Row and Berkshire Gifts on Eagle Street.

The sketch is a black, white and red outline of a woman's body. It belongs to artist and developer Eric Rudd, and owner of the building in question. Rudd was quite surprised by Moulton's ordinance idea.

"If [Moulton's] law was passed elsewhere in the world, it would permanently shut down places like Paris, Rome and even the Vatican," Rudd said.

Moulton said he appreciates art, but believes it should be displayed in certain places. "A mother walking her kids in a stroller wouldn't be exposed to it. If we don't do something, what's the next step? How far do we let this go?"

Another councilor, William Donovan wanted to hear more, but expressed some skepticism saying, "If we pass that, we're going to look like a rerun of the Beverly Hillbillies."

Rudd elaborated that, "With North Adams being admired throughout the nation as a small community that is using the arts as its economic engine for revival...I'd hate to see North Adams become a laughingstock. I think this brings up many constitutional questions that I'm sure the City Council does not want to get into."

[I suppose another solution that Mr. Moulton could suggest would be that mother's with kids in strollers should be banned from the streets for their own protection. Would that be going too far?? Ed.]

Nudity Within The Family Unit

Recently, my nine-year-old daughter accidentally saw my genitalia, and I didn't know what to do. In general, at what age should parents stop allowing their kids to see them naked?

Louis: If you're talking about the parent's age, I'd say about 39, when the bulges and sags become really embarrassing! But seriously, it's difficult to pinpoint an exact age at which children should stop seeing their parents without their clothes on.

Melissa: Many people are trying to move away from the idea of modesty, believing it to be based on unhealthy feelings of shame. But modesty doesn't have much to do with the problem of shame. According to the Scriptures, shame entered the picture at the fall—when Adam and Eve disobeyed God and sin entered the world. Most passages that refer to nakedness and covering up the body have more to do with vulnerability and loss of dignity. The Bible doesn't teach that the body is something evil or shameful that needs to be hidden.

Children should be taught that their bodies are made by God and that they are beautiful and precious. Modesty should grow out of a sense of gratitude for what God has given us and a sense of responsibility about how God wants us to use our bodies. The Bible teaches modesty for a very good reason: Chastity is made more difficult without modesty. Your children will need a healthy respect for and understanding of modesty as they mature.

Louis: But to get back to your question, nudity within a family seems to be very much a culturally determined standard. Japanese families traditionally continue communal nude bathing in hot tubs throughout life, and so do Europeans. Psychiatrically speaking, the attitudes about nudity and the associated sexual behaviors seem to determine the effect of nudity on a child's development.

Attitudes about nakedness and sexuality begin to develop quite early. A baby senses nonverbal signals that demonstrate family members' feelings about sexuality. Shame, embarrassment, discomfort or delight are conveyed when diapers are changed or baths are given. On his or her own, a small child will discover the sensations associated with touching the genital area. Those pleasurable feelings may become confused if anxious adults bring shame into the picture.

Thus, nakedness within the family is interpreted through the lens of countless other experiences. When the experiences associated with nakedness are positive and healthy, that's fine. But when associated behaviors are inappropriately sexual or negative, real damage is done. Exposure to bare bodies is one thing, but any kind of erotic play is completely taboo! At early adolescence, children may become more uncomfortable about nudity because of the awakening of sexual arousal, especially if the family has been uncomfortable with sexuality or has never talked about healthy sex.

However, in a relaxed, intimate family circle, exposure to non-eroticized nudity should cause no damage. If your

Not only was I going to be in the midst of nudists, (and while I’ve gotten comfortable with myself being nude, being nude with others was quiet another thing) but they would also be Christians. And being with clothes minded Christians can sometimes be stressful, but unclothed? If they serve grape Kool-Aid, I’m outta there.

I was also going to CNC with two fellow Christian naturists who I had never met face to face, but had met and knew over the Internet. Try to tell your adult children, (my wife knew the WHOLE plan) that I was disappearing over Father’s Day with 2 guys they had never met or even heard of for a “camping” adventure. **Hello, Mortimer Brewster.**

Meeting my 2 traveling companions was a positive experience. Traveling to Ivor, Virginia through the Blue Ridge Mountains in a convertible under sunny, blue skies was another positive experience. Then driving through the opened security gate at White Tail Park into an A-1 nudist community was – well, for lack of a better term – a real eye opener. People walking around the grounds naked as if it were the most natural thing in the world to do. And 4 hours later, I had to agree.

CNC couldn’t have picked a better place than White Tail Park, (which I thought was oxymoronic until I realized it meant deer not people). The facility was impeccable. The staff superb, with the exception of the 1st guy we met who didn’t want to let my UK friend in after flying 4000 miles because he had left his driver’s license at home, (It was a safety precaution thing: with no license he had a perfect excuse not to drive on the “other side of the road”). Coaxing out a British Naturism Society photo and he got in.

The CNC program was well planned out and varied. Speakers were prepared and gave excellent presentations. Alan Parker did an awesome job, (I’ve got to read his book, The Nudist Among Us). Tom Pine’s presentation started with, “Has naturism had an impact on your faith?” We could have spent the whole session on THAT alone, but he had 5 MORE topics to cover in an hour, (I’m tempted to read HIS book – scary, but I need to expand my comfort level). John Grimes did a presentation on Blood Covenants that was as good an address, (although given in the nude) as I’ve ever heard in the textile world. And I only had 1 small page on which to take notes that could have filled a notebook, (by the way....didn’t someone say they would e-mail text and references?). Chief Dan challenged us with using our Christian and Naturist heritage and affinity for good in a variety of ways. Sunday saw a prayer service with Dick and Marsha that was innovative, unique and VERY meaningful. The Sunday worship and communion service left me speechless, which doesn’t happen often.

A Trustee committee was elected to spearhead the 2006 CNC. General comments I think were to include more music, singing and corporate worship sharing at the individual sessions. The ice breaker on Friday evening probably needed

to be expanded and limited: expanded in time and activity and limited in scope: at the end of the ice breaker, I felt a little overwhelmed with all the information and dialogue about Christian Naturism – and we hadn’t even gotten to the main sessions! In 2006, there will be an effort to expand attendance for greater geographic representation, although we had 2 Europeans with us. There was even consideration to see the CNC expand to Europe. But all in all – to be unabashedly trite – a good time was had by all.

And not to be forgotten – and maybe left to last as good things are – was the socializing and fellowship. Watching Myra snap photos of a nude Kevin on his Harley; Gwin and Boyd providing coffee in the AM, (I personally rose up each morning and called them blessed) as well as Earl Grey tea for the wandering Brit who shared my tent, and stimulating conversations with other Naturist Christians I had only met on the Net....priceless.

CNC? A, “you gotta do this in 2006” thing for those of you who value the spiritual impact of naturism on enriching your faith and walk with God, and communication, sharing and love with like-minded believers. Sign up. NOW !

nine-year-old of the opposite sex accidentally sees your genitalia, don’t make a big deal of it. Just say, “Sorry—I didn’t know you were here.” Then, if it seems appropriate, you might even talk with her about the differences between male and female anatomy. The talk could blossom into a natural discussion about reproductive physiology and the moral and relational aspects of sexuality. Nine might be a little late in these days of pervasive sexual awareness, but if you’re comfortable with the subject you may learn a lot from the discussion!

[Melissa and Louis McBurney, M.D., are marriage therapists. This is from their Winter 1996 column in Marriage Partners Magazine. Theirs is a thoughtful discussion of family nudity that avoids the typical knee jerk responses that so often pervade conservative Christian writing on the subject.

They make a number of solid points beautifully. First, they correctly point out the Bible’s rationale for clothing is for the issues of vulnerability and loss of dignity. Not because the body is shameful. Second, they touch on the culture specific standards of nudity/modesty in the family. Third, they touch on the developmental issues of emerging sexuality even in infancy and the role family attitudes play in this development. Fourth, they recognize and guard against eroticizing nudity within the family. Fifth, and closing the developmental circle, family nudity allows for a natural progression in the understanding of the body and sexuality in a healthy family context. Ed.]
