Women Win Top-free Victory

Elizabeth Book, ardent topfreedom advocate, was arrested at Daytona Beach in March 2004 when she exposed her breasts to protest laws that bar women from publicly going bare breasted in places that men legally can appear without a shirt. The Seventh Judicial Circuit Court of Appeals on Oct. 5 upheld a lower court opinion that Book can demonstrate topless as part of a legitimate political protest.

Book's attorney said the latest ruling is a victory for his client, who set out to test laws against nudity because she believes they are unfairly applied to women.

The Deputy City Attorney said the city, "respectfully disagrees with the opinion," and indicated that the city is looking into an appeal of the court's decision.

Meanwhile, Book faces charges in a separate case for appearing topless in front of topless Grecian statues near a city auditorium in July 2005. She was charged with disorderly conduct in connection with the incident.

The Nudist's are Coming!

A spiritual battle is shaping up over a naturist group's plans to locate a clothing-optional community on the edge of Belton, South Carolina.

A Prayer Task Force will have a prayer rally today from 1:30 to 2:30 p.m. The group will be praying that the Natura Christian Fellowship does not locate its subdivision and campground just outside the Belton city limits.

One of the leaders of the rally stated, "It is totally against biblical standards to walk around in the nude. The terrible thing about this group is they call themselves Christians. There is no possible way they could be Christians living this kind of lifestyle."

A spokesperson for Natura Christian Fellowship, countered that the group's members are Christians and have suffered for the open way they have handled their proposed development near Belton. She stated that, "To the best of my knowledge we are the first openly Christian organization to come out and say up front what we are doing." We thought this would be a more Christian way to do it."

Backing this up, Natura Christian Fellowship has invited the local citizens to learn more about their organization and the proposed community to meet with them Friday at 11:30 a.m. in the chapel on the Blake Dairy Road property.

"I honestly believe this is going to be beneficial for the town after we get over the misunderstandings about who we are," claimed Natura's spokesperson. "We want to build a line of communication with people and let them know they don't have to worry about a bunch of people running around naked downtown."

However, a group of residents is considering a request that the area around the proposed resort be zoned to restrict the kind of development on the property, but not whether residents wear clothing said an Anderson County planning director. *[Hmmm! What a novel idea – but it has a familiar ring to it. Let's see if I have this right – disagree with someone on personal religious grounds and use government to strong arm them out of business. How charitable! Ed.]*

The open meeting for the community was held. Surprisingly, very few people actually showed up and no detractors showed up at all! One man dominated the questions, but it was peaceful and he tried to understand. The others were very supportive in their questions without being judgmental

One lady, the first one who showed up, was a nice little "church lady" type of person. I had no idea how she would react. Turned out she was a naturist and Christian and quietly supported us!

One County official was there, and he looked disappointed that those who complained to him were not there! A Natura spokesperson lamented that the ones who "prayed" for us to leave were not there either. "I wish these people were here today. It saddens me because I had hoped they would come and talk to us." *[No need for anyone to be surprised at the no shows. It's the old rope-a-dope, don't confuse me with the facts ploy. Who in their judgmental right mind needs to talk when they have their mind already made up? Ed.]*

Neo-nudism in Japan

She works from home as an IT consultant, going out only when she has to give a presentation or attend a meeting. She punctuates her work with some vacuuming, cleaning and preparing meals. It's a life like any other woman, except she does everything in the nude.

She is one of Japan's growing throng of neo-nudists, or newdists, if you will. The nudist boom is being buffered by more celebrities revealing they spend much of their private lives in their birthday suits, the emergence of Ekoda-chan, a popular manga character whose entire family goes naked to save on energy costs, and the mixi SNS, which has over 1,000 members of its "naked families" group.

At home she elaborates, "I take off my panties and strip fully nude, which unconsciously seems to bring me closer to what I'm really feeling, which in turn makes me feel like I'm going to come up with productive thoughts."

Earlier this year, a California IT company conducted a worldwide survey, finding that about 10 percent of men and women who worked from home did so while naked. Japanese nudists are catching on, like the executive who runs an IT company.

"I'm more creative when I'm naked," states one businessman. "When work is really pressuring me, I head out naked onto my verandah and gaze out into the distance while I think. Nakedness gives you a liberating feeling you couldn't possibly expect to find in a corporate atmosphere and I think there have been many occasions when it has directed me toward arriving at a decent business plan."

The author of "Nuudo Raifu he no Shotai (Invitation to a Nude Life)," and her family have been living a naturist's lifestyle for the past 20 years. She implores potential "newdists" to try out nudity as a way to, well, buff up character.

"It can turn introverts into positive thinkers," she says. "Go to a nudist beach overseas and there are all types there. By getting nude with them, all your complexes are openly accepted and it feels like you are freed by the experience. If you're nude every day, you're being yourself in the rawest possible form and that seems to make communication smoother."

S. R. Ueki is not surprised. "Going nude is the most effective way to create a successful work routine. Especially for those doing creative work, there's a need at times to re-think the way you interpret things and stripping everything off can be a good start toward achieving that," the psychologist stated. "Being naked is thrilling and that stimulation can spark all sorts of good ideas."

His personal statement on naturism as follows, gives something of the flavor of his webpage:

Christian Naturism?

It would surprise many Christians today to discover that nudity was not unknown, once, in the church. During the first three to four centuries of Christianity, baptism was often practiced without clothes. It was also often common for early Christians to use the Roman baths as places to relax, even though this usually involved mixed nudity. This is because the Bible makes it clear that the body is a good gift from God; something to be valued, so the Christian should use this gift in ways that are not indecent. Nudity is not in and of itself, wicked or lewd ~ it's how we use our bodies, for good or for ill that is important.

"When the human body is in its God created state, it is labeled by many today as unfit to be seen. The question therefore must be asked, 'how can we malign something so highly regarded by the Creator Himself without maligning Him?' The answer, of course, is that you cannot"

As someone who has always enjoyed the beauty of life and creation, I had a long struggle with the rightness or wrongness of social nudity, and it was only as a result of that struggle that I came to understand that Naturism was beneficial. I began to strip. And then, my clothes were off. I can proudly say, I was the first to get nude. He smiled and dropped his clothes as well.

Now came the next biggie – walking across the meadow toward everyone in our birthday suits. Next thing you know, a couple of volleyball players stopped their game and greeted us. Everyone was so nice. They began introducing themselves, and were even more friendly when they found out it was our first time.

It was hard to be self-conscious at this point, because there were so many different shapes and sizes of people. No one had perfect bodies, but everyone seemed to be comfortable with their own. It was so much fun.

We did a little bit of everything. We got in the paddle boats, swimming pool, hot tub and even a game of volleyball. Not only did we get to play volleyball, but I scored the winning serve.

Usually, a woman would feel uncomfortable around nude men. But there was nothing sexual about the entire day. We just had a lot of fun! When it was time to go, I wished we had rented a cabin. I think I am definitely a nudist from here on out.

I did cheat a little bit. I HAD really long red hair. From time to time I would pull my hair over my shoulders, so that it would cover my breasts. Well, I'm over that now. I had it cut just below my shoulders. No more hiding, no more shame!

I hopped from the warm hot spring water to the ice-cold spring water, then immediately hopped back into the hot spring water. The whole place was quite, and even the whisper was silent. What Are We Doing Here?

Last month it was remarked that Lake Edun began due to the vision, idealism and personal investment of one family. Since then many individuals and families have pooled their efforts to keep the dream of Lake Edun alive.

We all have to realize that a dream is wonderful, but actions are everything. For over one hundred years naturists around the world haven't simply been theorists about the potential benefits of naturism. Yes, they wrote books promoting the naturist ideal, but they then went out and did what was necessary to bring their ideals to life. They took a stand, investing their time, energy, money and reputations in making naturism, with all its benefits, a reality in the face of opposition.

Wherever in the world naturists have gone over the past century, there have been those who tried by whatever means available to block their efforts. Despite opposition, naturism has spread around the globe. It might be said that opposition is merely a challenge naturists have seized upon to spur them on to greater creativity and energy to overcome all obstacles. This has paid off. Some boast that naturism in America now represents nearly a half billion dollar industry.

What is it that would capture the imagination and energize so many to dedicate their selves to naturism so fiercely?

The earliest naturists were reformers, reacting against the dehumanizing aspects of industrialization and urbanization of the late 19th century. Contact with the natural world was being replaced with manufactured goods. Victorian mores dominated the culture, the human body was deemed as shameful, and needing to be hidden and shaped by clothing.

The antidote the reformers prescribed was that people needed exposure to the natural healing elements or fresh air, sunlight, and water – preferably with loose or absent clothing. Eventually some suggested that nudity must be an integral part of lifestyle reform.

In more recent times, benefits of naturism have included relaxation, stress reduction, improved self-esteem, satiation of curiosities about the human body, reduction or elimination of interest in pornography, diminishment of a consuming interest in sex, the provision of a natural setting for teaching children healthy body attitudes, assistance in healing the emotional scars of sexual abuse, and development of a more wholesome attitude toward the opposite sex.

One naturist put it this way, “I tend to think of nudism as an attitude – a belief that nudity is a comfortable state of being, to be enjoyed in the company of those who feel likewise. I retain that belief even when “those who feel likewise” just includes my wife, so I'm still a nudist.”

We can not leave the cataloguing of benefits of naturism without noting the emphasis placed on body acceptance as crucial to any understanding of modern naturism. The pages of Bare Facts and other naturist publications have much to say about this. While not an exhaustive list, the benefits of naturism noted are not trivial.

What naturism means to each naturist is both personal and collective. This can range from participating in naturism as a cause, i.e., having a philosophy and lifestyle, to mainly viewing it as enjoyable recreation. Regardless, there is room for all who share the view that the human body is not shameful and is not the cause of anything harmful.

There are some things we do because we enjoy them; some things we do because we have an obligation to do them; and some because we believe in them. If we allow others to define the limits of our freedom, and there are those in this community that seek to do just that, we don't really have freedom. LEF is attempting to defend one little bit of our freedom. Based on comments heard in our area, it is likely that we enjoy much more popular support than the “moral police,” and our politicians suspect.

All the research I know of supports our position that living a clothing-free lifestyle and raising your children in the same atmosphere is beneficial. Many of our detractors seem to believe, without a shred of scientific evidence to support them, that our lifestyle is somehow harmful to society, especially children. Unless we take a strong position to spread the word, their misinformed belief will become the defacto “fact,” and we will be relegated to being “adult” entertainment as has happened at Hippie Hollow in Texas. Such a determination will be the first step to closing down all c/o venues.

A truism you all have heard is that freedom isn't free – it has to be defended. For the most part, only naturists are going to do that. Since we don't live in a utopia, it takes our time, talent, and money to make available all that we have at Lake Edun. In return we receive something of tangible value, and of much which is intangible, but nonetheless real. Who can place a dollar value on the beauty of a sunset reflected on the lake, or for laughter among friends around a campfire, or the freedom to associate with those of like mind?

Your primary interest in Lake Edun may be mainly for escape and relaxation, but know that your option to experience this pleasure is not guaranteed. Lake Edun, at minimum, has to have the backing of all who enjoy nude recreation to continue to operate. Membership in LEF and generous donations from day visitors are essential to our survival. Please understand that Lake Edun is not now nor ever has been a profit making venture.

Just what the continued existence of Lake Edun means to each of us is a personal decision. Everyone who does enjoy going to Lake Edun has to make the choice to contribute financially to grant everyone the opportunity to continue enjoying this bit of freedom in paradise. There are among our number those that believe in Lake Edun so strongly, despite not being able to visit often, unselfishly choose to hold annual membership in LEF.
