## Nude Youth Camp Opponent Resigns

Friday, September 29<sup>th</sup>, congressman Mark Foley (R-Fla) issued an apology and resigned from Congress following revelations of e-mail he had sent to a teen age male Congressional page.

This is the same Congressman who two years ago raised such a stink nationally about the AANR sponsored teen summer camps. The resulting uproar caused camp cancellations, and highly restrictive legislation in Virginia aimed at the White Tail Park teen summer camp.

[Through his own folly, Mr. Foley will no longer be around to use naturism as a vehicle to advance his own political ambitions. His ardent and unreasonable opposition to naturism in the name of protecting the children has to give us pause.

Not all opponents of naturism are hiding their own aberrant behavior behind a hypocritical mask. With some public officials the case can be made that naturism is good and healthy, or at least not harmful, and receive a hearing. Officials in Miami Beach are a good example.

However, what we now know helps us to understand Mr. Foley's motivation at the time, and the inability to reach any reasonable accommodation with him. As another has commented, "...we'll never understand what these people go through on a daily basis, confronting their own psyches, neuroses, sexualities and identities. It isn't easy to live what is a hypocritical life – knowing that you have this/that instinct and having to satisfy the "norm." Ed.]

## It's Rebelliousness Folks

This summer, a group of teenagers has disrobed near restaurants, bookstores and the town's many galleries, igniting a debate about whether the town of Brattleboro should ban a practice long tolerated until now.

"Brattleboro tends to be a laid-back town and pretty accepting of the unusual, but this is really pushing limits," said the Police Chief. "It's clearly to outrage people, it's clearly rebelliousness."

By most accounts, the stripping started on a whim in early summer when a young woman sat naked on a park bench, Martin said. Then another woman started taking her shirt off downtown. Later, a music festival promoting nudity and rebelliousness set up in May in a downtown parking lot attracted nude hula hoopers.

Last month, a half dozen young people bared their bodies in a parking lot, encircled by the backs of bookstores, coffee shops and restaurants.

"It's just an act of freedom," said one 19-year-old, "We're just doing so because we can." He and the others say they "do not consider nakedness to be innately sexual or rude and it shouldn't be confined to that."

One towns person said, "To most people, it's not a big deal," Meanwhile, at Everyone's Books, one of the owners said the parking lot may not be the most appropriate place for nudity, but "as long as people are polite, don't block the entrance, we don't ask them to leave."

To others, it's disturbing and something more than harmless rebellion. "It's a bad image for Brattleboro," said one restaurant owner whose establishment has long been a teen hangout.

Vermont has no state laws against public nudity, but communities can write their own bans. So far, Brattleboro has chosen not to join them. For now city leaders are weighing their options, and waiting for summer to turn to fall.

"As soon as winter comes, there won't be a story anymore," said the Town Clerk. [Who knows, perhaps this rebellion might catch on. As for the government's response, is this common sense or what? Ed.]

## 84% Of Brits Would Buy A Home Next Door To Naturists

The great heat wave of 2006 may already seem like a distant memory, but as the summer draws to a close, a new survey by property website propertyfinder.com reveals that millions of Britons have been stripping off completely on terraces, balconies and in gardens all over the UK.

A startling 19.7% of respondents say they have got their kit off outside while at home on at least one occasion, equivalent to around 11 million people. The figures also suggest people are not going to great lengths to ensure nobody sees them, with 21% saying that they have caught their neighbors in the altogether at some point.

It would appear that traditional British stuffiness is diminishing as the findings reveal Brits to be fairly relaxed about the possibility of having naked neighbors. When asked if they would be put off buying a house with nudists next door, 50% said they would have 'no concern at all', while 34% said they wouldn't mind as long as they did not have to see their neighbors naked. Only 16% said they would not want to buy a home in these circumstances.

Younger people were less likely to have concerns than older people. 59% of the under 45s would have 'no concern.'

Warren Bright, chief executive of propertyfinder.com said: "It seems that the Brits' traditional prudishness is a thing of the past. The vast majority of homeowners are fine with neighborhood nudity. What upsets people far more is noise and antisocial behavior. A quiet neighborhood is a big draw to the vast majority of buyers, whether the neighbors are clothed or otherwise."

This research also suggests that naturism is much more widespread than might be believed. While there are just 16,000 members of British Naturism in the UK and around 130 'sun clubs', the statistics suggest that many millions of us have at some point bared all in our gardens. Naturists are incredibly considerate and take great care not to offend. The seclusion of a back garden is the ideal place. Why not give it a try?

# What Are We Doing Here?

Several years ago there was a hunting club several miles southwest of Topeka. Through the vision, idealism, and personal investment of one family, this became what we know as Lake Edun.

In the light of hindsight, the wisdom of this decision might be questioned. Certainly, the cost in treasure, peace of mind, and grief has been high. Quite simply, it's become a mind numbing, slogging struggle to keep moving forward in the face of entrenched opposition. This may not be the Flint Hills, but a harder soil than Topeka for planting naturism would be difficult to find in the state of Kansas. What is it about Lake Edun that so enrages it's detractors to such heights of venom about the activities of people that they neither observe nor have to interact with?

Ignorance, intolerance, and injustice are synonymous with the treatment Lake Edun has received. Who needs this? An outside observer could be forgiven for asking why anyone in their right mind would persist with Lake Edun.

Why indeed? What are we doing here? What passion, what ideals motivate a tiny band of people to commit themselves to such an audacious proposition that Lake Edun must persist, and must not perish?

Everyone who visits or has ever been a member of the Lake Edun Foundation has to find their own answer to this question. No doubt the answers we would hear would be varied and range from the superficial to the profound. Yet, each person would know that there is something special about being at Lake Edun. Something that makes them feel better, and enriches their lives in a way that no other daily experience does.

It isn't illegal to be nude on private property – else no one would bathe. It isn't illegal to be nude on private property in mixed company – else married couples – well you know – wouldn't.... What people can't seem to stand, what seems to drive them nuts, is the mere **idea** that unrelated people of mixed gender get together on private property, nude! By the way, this isn't illegal either.

No one who visits Lake Edun is unaware of a cost, a price they pay just for stepping foot on the grounds. This isn't a monetary cost – far from it. It is a cost all who dare to ignore the established rules of society have to pay. In the language of social change theory, anyone embracing social nudity is a forerunner. That is, they are ahead of the crowd. That can become an uncomfortable place to be, as the timid wait to see which way the wind is blowing, and supporters of the status quo toss hand grenades.

The modern nudist/naturist movement goes back to the late 19<sup>th</sup> century in Germany. There, a number of idealists fed up with industrialization and the mechanization of society proposed nudism as a means to reconnect with nature and their common humanity.

The nudist/naturist movement championed the belief that the body in all its parts and functions is good. This being so, men

and women could reject the false shame, and prudish values and beliefs the Victorian era held about the body. Casting off the mandatory clothing society prescribed, opened the way for acceptance of self and others without pretense or exploitation. This mutual revealing of the body was, and remains a radically liberating statement about both acceptance of the natural body, and the relationship between the sexes as being one of equality and mutual respect.

Thus, naturism came to be defined in 1974 by the International Naturist Federation as follows: Naturism is a way of life in harmony with nature characterized by the practice of social nudity, with the intention of encouraging self-respect, respect for others, and respect for the environment.

To understand naturism, you must understand the profound respect naturists hold for the body, both the body of the individual, and the bodies of others – male and female. In doing so, naturists reject the explicit and implicit disdain for the body that has become so ingrained in our culture over the past two centuries. Naturists of a theistic bent respect their bodies and see God's beauty in them.

Every person that visits Lake Edun, or is a member of the Lake Edun Foundation is saying a resounding NO! to the conventional wisdom that the naked body is shameful, can only induce lust, and will harm children. Every person that participates with the Lake Edun Foundation in furthering its mission of body acceptance is declaring a positive vision of treating themselves and other humans as valued persons, not objects to be used for selfish ends.

It is mistakenly believed by the larger culture that lust and sexual exploitation are inherent in mixed gender nudity. It is as though in their minds they can not conceive of themselves being able to lay aside this mindset, so they project that no one else can. The Lake Edun Foundation stands as another testimonial, among thousands worldwide, that this debasing belief about the body is false. Lake Edun stands proudly for the truth that people can make moral choices toward one another, and that men and women can gaze upon one another's bodies in the simplicity of open communication and respect.

## Naked Plays Rescheduled

Because of a heavy year of drama in Topeka this year, actors interested in performing in our Naked Plays seem to be "burnt out". For that reason, we have decided to reschedule production of our annual event until Spring.

## It's Déjà Vu All Over Again

A Wyoming Community College's trustees are questioning whether to allow the expansion of a campus art exhibit because two of the new pieces contain nudity.

Five paintings by the same artist, each showing images of famous cave art, currently hang in the hallway of the archaeology department. He now would like to hang seven more pictures.

However, college trustees are not so sure they want the additional paintings. One of the pictures depicts a large nude woman – a traditional image of health, prosperity and abundance, Newton said – and another showed a man dressed as a half-man, half-elk creature with its genitals showing.

The problem the trustees have is that children on field trips from school often pass through the hallway while viewing dinosaur fossils.

One trustee opined that, "I couldn't approve it unless I heard from someone like an elementary curriculum coordinator telling me that that was appropriate curriculum for elementary-age children."

The artist is prepared to wait for a decision about hanging the new pieces, but that all the series of paintings have to be shown together, whether here or someplace else.

## Beware Teachers Of Art

Attention all art teachers! This month an award-winning Texas art teacher lost her job. She had previously been reprimanded after one of her fifth-grade students saw a nude sculpture during a trip to a Dallas art museum. School board members voted not to renew her contract.

As a school sponsored trip to the Dallas Museum of Art in April of 2006, parents signed permission slips. Further, the teacher in question states it was the principal who urged her to take the students to the museum.

The teacher was admonished by the principal after a parent complained a student had seen nude art. The 28 year veteran, who had just two years earlier been awarded a Star Teacher Award, was then placed on administrative leave.

The school board has responded that the issue of the museum and parents complaints had nothing to do with dismissal of the teacher. They contend previously existing questions about job performance were not resolved. In addition, the Star Teacher Award is not a school district award. It is only a community recognition award. [*Why is it we pander to the ignorant parent who knows nothing about art? - Ed.*]
