Nuff Said

Florida Sheriff Links Prostitution/Naturism

I've heard tell that at this point in the political year it's called "the silly season." Of course where politicians are concerned, we need to realize that silliness is their stock in trade. Unfortunately, a certain number of them get elected and

inflict their silliness on us all. Case in point is the assertion, without a shred of evidence, by the current Sheriff in Florida that naturism, swinging, and prostitution are linked. All the Sheriff proves to me is that ignorance and politicians are linked. Even the local press was struck by the silliness of this.

The reporter asks (tongue in cheek), is nudism a kind of gateway drug to prostitution?

During a candidate forum this week in Dade City, the current Sheriff drew a direct link between the two ways of life.

He picked up on the prostitution theme – and elaborated.

"I think we have the most nudist colonies in this county of any county, I think, in the country," the sheriff said. "With nudists and swinging and that sort of thing ... comes prostitution, and we have a number of adult entertainment (businesses)."

The sheriff is correct that Pasco has a high per-capita nudist resort count – most in Florida – and their revenues are the county's second-biggest tourism earner.

Controversies boil up every year or so. Most recently, Caliente Resort & Spa temporarily lost its membership in a national nudism group because of its advertised swinger parties. Homeowners there try to emphasize nudism as natural and nonsexual, not nymphomaniacal and deviant.

But prostitution? That's a whole new charge.

In response, Richard Mason for the Florida Naturist Association stated: First, there is no connection between prostitution and nude night clubs. Or for that matter with nudist beaches or nudists resorts.

What some candidates and anti-nudity interest groups do is try to connect nudity to rapes and child molestation. There is no connection.

The most common connection to rapists, and sexual serial criminals, is that they were Bible readers. It's in the FBI studies. [Does that mean we should criminalize Bible reading? - Ed]

I made a study of the Miami area back in the early 90s and was told by the police department that there was no connection between nudity and sex crimes.

A call to the FBI's Behavior Science Lab in Quantico, Virginia will confirm that. Any candidate for Sheriff who makes that connection is a liar. He needs to be exposed as such – now. The FBI will be the first to tell you that local police departments misuse their Crime Statistic Report for their benefit.

What this illustrates is the all too common tactic of politicians and some in law enforcement to make political hay on the backs of some minority they believe is held as suspect by the public. It's a cheap form of bigotry that the public needs to recognize and reject. Too often when an "authority figure" utters something, it passes as truth, unchallenged. Naturists are a vulnerable and often friendless minority group that may be targeted as a focus for public hostility in the service of personal ambition. When this happens, silliness becomes very serious. [Ed.]

Expectations

It may seem unnecessary, it may seem obvious, but experience proves that every now and then a review of basic expectations for all participants at Lake Edun is required. We don't want anyone who visits Lake Edun to be surprised either by the requirements of naturist etiquette or expectations for conduct.

1. We at Lake Edun promote the wholesomeness of the nude human body and the liberating experience of social nudity. We want to share with everyone who will visit the good things we have found about naturism. To this end, we encourage our members to talk up the Lake Edun Foundation and the positives of nude living. It is our desire to make it clear to all visitors that they are welcome and strive to make them comfortable. It is our pleasure to promote everyone's comfort in a variety of ways, especially for all visitors, whether they have been long time naturists, or those making the transition from being a textile to being a delighted naturist.

Facilitating visitor comfort is the job of every member. Members please introduce yourselves and point out the features of the Lake. Offer to show visitors around and introduce them to members. Let visitors know you understand they may have questions or have mixed feelings about shedding their clothes in public.

When members bring guests they need to prepare their friends beforehand for what to expect. Visitors can be made to feel more at ease by learning something of naturist history and ideals, what naturist etiquette entails, and what standards

of conduct are expected at Lake Edun. Our shorthand for expectations is – no glass, no clothes, no jerks.

Everyone who visits Lake Edun must be informed that Lake Edun is not a clothing optional venue for adults. We don't apologize for this requirement or make exceptions. This being said, we do grant first time visitors an undefined, but brief period of time to acclimate to a nude venue prior to disrobing. For some, it may be helpful to take a walk on the trail system to the west of the lake and experience being nude in nature without others around.

We aren't running a stop watch on any visitor before they must undress, but in general a few minutes is all most people need before "taking the plunge." We have no intention to offend, but if after a reasonable time a visitor has made no effort to disrobe, they will be approached to enquire about their hesitation. Every effort will be made to answer questions and offer reassurance.

In the end, we recognize that social nudity may not be for everyone. If that is the case, we are glad you visited and hope that sometime in the future there will be a change of heart. However, we must with our best wishes, and all due respect, ask you to leave our company. This will ensure your comfort and not impose on our members and others who come with the expectation that all at the lake are nude.

2. The board of directors is stressing that every visitor must sign in at the Barn. Signing in includes presenting a picture ID in the form of a driver's license. All visitors must write their name on the sign-in sheet and show their driver's license to the caretaker every time they visit. Everyone's cooperation with this request allows us to know who is at Lake Edun. Please be aware that we do check everyone against a national sex offender registry database. We make no assumptions about anyone, but we owe it to everyone to practice due diligence for the safety of all.

Members of the Lake Edun Foundation need not sign in. They need only make their presence known to the caretaker. If there is no caretaker, jot your name and date on a slip of paper and put it in the slot in the barn.

It is the board of director's hope that this review of expectations clarifies our policies and eliminates misunderstandings. Have a great nude day!

Nudity

The following article was a submission to a web site called Articles Bridge.com by Elea Almazora. Ms Almazora displays an elegant common sense about public non sexual nudity. It leaves us thinking, “Of course, how sensible.”

Sadly, body phobia and misguided moralizing interferes with clear thinking for too many people. Instead, they react to simple nudity with predictable horror and prudery. As predictable is the hackneyed argument meant to end all argument with a supposedly self evident declaration , “We have to protect the children!”

Nonsense! What children are most in need of is protection from dangerous adults who truly are abusive to children physically, sexually, emotionally, or neglectful. From assaults on the minds and bodies of children come the wounds and scars lasting a lifetime. Less obvious, and certainly not criminal, are misguided adults that unknowingly foster body shame and fears, all without proof, that the mere sight of a nude body will cause damage.

The very concept that the body is “indecent” is perpetrating injury on young impressionable minds. They are learning not to value or accept their own bodies. If a trusted grownup says it, it must be true. And the cycle goes unbroken. Ms Almazora offers a more sensible view. [Ed.]

I have nothing against nudity, especially if there is no specific law that states nudity is illegal. As far as I could figure, the only laws that may affect anyone's right to wear (or in this case, not wear) anything they please would be the laws regarding public indecency. But this is where the problems lie – everyone likes putting in their own two cents with regards to the definition of public indecency. Often, this would include things like urinating in public, or “playing with one's self” in a public bathroom. But other times people will fly off the handle about certain things that baffle me.

Does anyone remember that one incident where a picture of a woman breastfeeding her child caused an outrage and was referred to by many as “disgusting”? I was so very surprised at the negative reaction to the picture, considering the fact that I am sure that most of us were breastfed by our own mothers – there is nothing indecent about a woman pulling out here breast to feed a baby. In fact, I am of the opinion that there is nothing wrong at all with being naked, so long as there is no malice behind the nudity.

I have to wonder why we as a society had to become so prudish about the idea of being naked and why naked should necessarily equate to sex. I know HOW we came to be this way – religion had a big role in demonizing our own bodies, so much so that we have become ashamed of everything we were born with. This is precisely why I have utmost respect for people who indulge in “clothing optional” affairs, especially people who go to nudist beaches. I honestly think that they are genuinely marveling in just being themselves, without the fetters of clothing and the dictates of society. There is nothing malicious in their nudity. They are only comfortable that way, and they are not at all propositioning anyone by the state of their undress. There is no need to make a big deal out of it.

Nudity: Un-Covering A Bashful America

After contacting the author, she graciously consented to allow her article to be reprinted in Bare Facts. Her experiences and discoveries give us a cross cultural perspective on attitudes toward the body. Through her eyes we learn that there isn't just one right way of viewing nudity. The casual normalcy with which Czech citizens regard the unclothed body in a range of settings is refreshing. Sadly, even to recover previously accepted forms of body acceptance such as breast feeding and communal showers in this country seems nearly utopian in today's uptight world, [Ed.].

For the first year I lived in Prague, I found myself blushing whenever I glimpsed a bare body. Between the communal gym showers, topless sunbathing and popular therapeutic spas, it occurred more often than I expected. Although I didn't think I was a prude, I was used to more privacy and less exposed flesh in similar situations in America.

In my fitness center's locker room, I wrapped myself into a towel, (a habit leftover from adolescent gym class days) before I shed my underclothes and donned my workout gear. When it was time to use the communal shower, I soaped up quickly and didn't make eye-contact with anyone. I was envious of all the Czech teenagers and women who showered luxuriously, dried their hair wearing only their underpants, and chatted with their locker mates either partially or fully in the nude.

During the summer months, my cheeks got red when I passed the topless sun bathers at Prague's large outdoor swimming pool in Podolí. Although I had seen them on the beaches in Nice and Cannes, I categorized it as something that locals did, but not someone like me. In my mind, sun bathing without your top was something you'd do only in your own backyard. Doing it in public seemed like exhibitionism. When I did a double take after seeing bare-breasted mothers chasing children on the beach in Croatia, I realized again how culturally ingrained my idea of nudity was.

That summer I often spent weekend afternoons with my then-new Czech boyfriend Radek at one a lake near Prague. When he asked me why I never took off my top, I tried to explain, but my argument that it just isn't typically done in America fell flat. When I confessed I was too shy, he raised his eyebrows in confusion. I began to question myself as well.

When we traveled to Croatia, I decided to be brave. We camped out on a deserted beach and when the sun came up, Radek jumped into the water without his swimming suit. I followed him. Although I was shy once the beach was abuzz with bathers, I did manage to enjoy the experience once I managed to suppress my cultural self-consciousness.

The following winter while on a ski vacation with friends in the Alps, we visited a thermal spa. Although I'd swum nude in Croatia and occasionally sunbathed topless at lakes in the Czech Republic, I had never been naked in public in front of anyone that I actually knew (except Radek). I began work myself into a bad mood, which was ridiculous because after a long day of skiing, I had looked forward to relaxing in the

mineral waters and sauna. So, I donned a smile, stripped down and tried to remember Radek's advice that the worst thing to be is self-conscious. Once we were in the hot sauna, I was able to relax and even forget, (a little) about being naked. People of all ages were there, and it was clear that everyone had only one idea in mind – to relax.

After living in Prague for a year and a half, when we moved back to America, I realized I had to readjust my ideas of what was appropriate. Our fitness center had a curtained area for changing as well as individual shower stalls. Even then, many people that I knew arrived in gym clothes and put off showering until they returned home. Changing clothes on a beach required finding a changing room, instead of just stripping down lakeside like we'd done in the Czech Republic. And although we saw a few women sunbathing with their tops untied, no one was actually topless.

Before having children, it didn't occur to me that these cultural differences would also cross-over to breastfeeding. While the breastfeeding trend is currently heavily promoted by medical professionals in both countries, it is only in America, with our long-history of Puritanism that breastfeeding, specifically in public places, is a hotly debated topic.

In August 2006, BabyTalk, a free parenting magazine published in the US, ran on its cover a picture of a baby nursing a bare breast. The magazine received more than 700 letters and incited a public debate about the appropriateness of breastfeeding in public. In an Associated Press response by Jocelyn Noveck entitled, "Strong reaction to public feeding revealed," Noveck wrote that Americans are "squeamish over the sight of a nursing breast." She also cited a 2004 survey where only 43 % of respondents believed women should have the right to breastfeed in public. Even women who breastfed for their baby's health didn't believe their husbands or sons should have to see it.

Living back in the Czech Republic in the fall of 2006, I used the magazine cover as well as Noveck's article as fodder for discussion in my English class at the K2 mother's center. All my students were mothers and most, if not all, had nursed their children. Aside from being aghast that a mother's right to nurse in public could ever be denied, they were also genuinely surprised that many American women would be reluctant to nurse in public. Breastfeeding in the Czech Republic is considered normal and natural and women are encouraged to feed their babies whenever necessary.

I've also noticed that where children are concerned when temperatures get warm, the fewer clothes the better is the general rule in the Czech Republic. On a hot summer day in the Třebešín Park in Prague's Malešice neighborhood, the small, shaded wading pool overflows with tiny splashing bodies. Although there are more than twenty bodies in the water, I spot just a handful of swimming suits. Most of the children splash naked and a few wear swim bottoms. Anna Lee is the only child sporting a full one-piece complete with ruffled skirt.

We've encountered similar situations at the local pools and when she took swim lessons, the other mothers would always comment on Anna's full swim suit. Most of their sons and daughters wore very tiny swim bottoms. Trying to wriggle Anna in and out of her bathing suit for emergency bathroom runs made me wish she had on only bottoms, but she's proud of her suits with ruffles. She's gone swimming naked a few times at her aunt's pool, and I'm sure this summer will bring more of occasions for swimming with (and without) her suit. There is, I stress, nothing wrong with full-frontal nudity provided that the naked person in question does nothing inappropriate or anything that may make anyone feel uncomfortable (save for being naked; I understand that seeing someone with no clothes on may disturb people, but unless the person is touching himself or acting suspiciously, it really shouldn't bother anyone at all). But since I also think

that there should be some due consideration for the people who feel iffy about topless or naked people, I'm perfectly content with the idea of having "clothing optional" places for people who feel constricted by their clothes and have no other agenda save for being nude and becoming comfortable in their own skin (so to speak).

This brings me to my final point: I find it disturbing that nowadays, nudists and the like are being marginalized in the sense that more and more of their "spaces" – like clothing-optional beaches – are being taken away from them because "people are complaining". Again, there is nothing perverse about liking to be nude, and they have done nothing at all to offend you save for being unclothed. They don't actively bother you, so it really would be nice for you to not actively bother them. They are not in your face about you preferring to have clothes on, so there would be no reason to be in their face. Let the "clothing optional" crowd keep their beaches and spots, please. It would be appreciated if not enough controversy is stirred up to prompt governments to completely ban being comfortable without clothes on.

There is freedom in letting it all hang out, and letting it all hang out close to nature, out in the air, should not be thought of as disgusting; rather, it should be inspiring.

Save your Aluminum; Bring it to the Lake. It's time for us to take it in.
