# City Turns Deaf Ear To Nude Beach

The city of Delray Beach, Florida is in the news due to the request by David Armstrong, speaking on behalf of area nudists for an official nude beach.

This group has been lobbying for a clothing optional beach for the last six years.

Armstrong notes that those who like to swim nude pay taxes and deserve a portion of beach set aside for clothing optional use. He claims it would bring millions in revenue to Delray Beach, possibly as much as \$100 million dollars a year based on a study of the economic impact of Haulover Beach near Miami.

The vice mayor scoffed at the projected millions in revenue that would come to the area and dismissed any intention of changing city ordinances to accommodate a clothing optional beach. His rationale is such a beach wouldn't fit with the child-friendly and family-friendly principles found in Delray Beach.

Armstrong has gathered 45,000 signatures from residents, visitors and local business owners and plans to attend a January 25<sup>th</sup> meeting with city officials to continue his lobbying efforts.

Going commando, being freed, is a great statement to make for prostate cancer which is a taboo subject for men. National Commando Day is an anti-stigma campaign about prostate cancer. But neither they nor their doctors even knew they had

it. With early detection, prostate cancer can be treatable. If detected too late, many die from this cancer.

## **Lice Tell Us About Clothing In The Past**

The story *Textile attitudes and our future* later in this issue, refers to lice mutations to date when humans started wearing clothing. A new study sheds more light on the question. Researchers at the University of Florida have announced the results of their five year study of human lice DNA to determine when humans might have first started wearing clothing. Their thesis was that, "Because they are so well adapted to clothing, we know that body lice or clothing lice almost certainly didn't exist until clothing came about in humans."

Their data indicates that modern humans started wearing clothes about 70,000 years before migrating into colder climates and higher latitudes, which began about 100,000 years ago. This date would be virtually impossible to determine using archaeological data because early clothing would not survive in archaeological sites.

The researchers say the study also shows humans started wearing clothes well after they lost body hair, which genetic skin-coloration research pinpoints at about 1 million years ago, meaning humans spent several hundred thousand years without body hair and without clothing. It wasn't until they had clothing that modern humans were then moving out of Africa into other parts of the world.

Lice, unlike most other parasites, are stranded on lineages of hosts over long periods of time. This long standing relationship allows scientists to learn about evolutionary changes in the host based on changes in the parasite.

A previous study of clothing lice from 2003 at the Max Planck Institute in Leipzig, Germany, estimated humans first began wearing clothes about 107,000 years ago. But this new study includes new data and calculation methods better suited for the question.

An anthropologist asked about the significance of the new study replied, "The new result from this lice study is an unexpectedly early date for clothing, much older than the earliest solid archaeological evidence, but it makes sense. It means modern humans probably started wearing clothes on a regular basis to keep warm when they were first exposed to Ice Age conditions."

The last Ice Age occurred about 120,000 years ago, but the study's date suggests humans started wearing clothes in the preceding Ice Age 180,000 years ago, according to temperature estimates from ice core studies. It is believed that modern humans first appeared about 200,000 years ago.

Regardless of how long ago clothing began to be worn, it appears the factor driving its development as an innovation was to deal with colder climate conditions outside Africa. Apparently humans managed to successfully exist for a long time without nudity (flaunted or not) causing social collapse. However, when needed to ensure survival, clothing became a welcome addition to human material culture. Those of us alive today are grateful for our ancestors' genius that makes our existence possible. Naturists just want to get back to this original functional purpose of clothing without the baggage of body shame promoted in the last few thousand years. [Ed.]

#### Too Old To Dare To Be Bare?

It's a fact. If we live long enough, we grow old. Of course at some point in life we may share the opinion expressed by George Bernard Shaw that youth is wasted on the young. Of course, Shaw was cantankerous sort. In any event when it comes to baring the body, society seems to be bothered.

Case in point. A news story from Australia explores this issue. Is there an age that we should cover up? Her point of departure is a 90 year old mom and her 60 year old daughter – both nudists.

Starting her day in grand style, Maud is having a good morning. Fresh from a win at bingo, the 90-year-old is en route to catching up with her daughter. Rather than heading for a nap, as people think that someone of these years might be doing, you would be wrong! Today, she's indulging in her favourite pastime - nudism.

Both are regular visitors to a nudist club in New South Wales Watagan Mountains where Maud and her daughter like nothing better than to strip off and enjoy their own piece of paradise.

"It's so beautiful there," Maud reflects. "Being naked is natural. The world would be a better place if we didn't have to wear clothes."

Earlier in the year Oscar-winning actor Dame Helen Mirren stirred up the debate after she shed her clothes for a photo shoot. A month short of her 65th birthday, Mirren was baffled by the controversy that erupted over photos of her in a bath.

"Honestly, what's the matter with people?" she asked. "It's ridiculous. It's because I'm old."

For Maud and Beth, and their fellow nudists, the idea of staying permanently clothed as they age rankles.

"Is there an age we should cover up?"

"God, no!" says one of their friends. "Why should any woman, at any age, cover up? You still feel the same inside as you did in your 20s."

The textile public has so many prissy rules – well, prejudices – about what bodies are ok to be uncovered. There is a fear of aging, and who likes all the changes age inevitably brings to the body, yet we all want to live a long as possible. It's a paradox.

Naturism says all bodies are good, and that one benefit of naturism is in educating children about all the changes that getting older brings. We applaud the spirit of Maud, Beth and Helen Mirren for accepting themselves as they are. [Ed.]

#### **Public Service Award**

A group of strippers from the Cheetah Club traded their poles for snow shovels in a topless attempt at clearing Times Square sidewalks. The NYPD reminded these civic minded citizens who were wearing stilettos and unbuttoned jackets at the time, revealing nothing but bare skin underneath that Times Square was now a family neighborhood.

"There were tourists and kids," said Bruce Lynn, a spokesman for the West 43rd Street club. "But the firemen liked it, and the sanitation workers liked it."

Protesting the innocence of their intentions, the strippers said they were just attempting to do their civic duty. "We're here helping the mayor clean the city up," said a dancer, who stood with six of her colleagues in the bone-chilling cold.

The group had to change locations after police shut down their first attempt at bare-breasted shoveling in front of the Nasdaq building, despite the fact that court ruling in the 1990s made it legal for women to be topless in New York. They let the Cheetah Club manager off with a warning.

The Cheetah Club had to close during the Dec. 26 blizzard and this was a way to let people know that the club was open for business, said a dancer who referred to herself Zsa Zsa.

"Everyone has to do their part," Zsa Zsa said of storm cleanup. "Even us."

#### **Ukrainian Protests**

# What Is The Problem With Nudity?

British psychologists conducted an experiment examining the question of why humans are so uncomfortable with nudity. A BBC documentary of the project is shown on YouTube. The experimental design involves eight volunteers, four male and four female who spend a weekend engaged in the experiment in hopes of providing answers to a number of questions. Initially half the group, evenly divided between men and women, one at a time strips in front of a one way mirror while being observed by one of the remaining four participants. They will remain nude for the next day and a half before dressing. At that time, the re-

maining four are undressed by the clothed participants.

The question of why high anxiety is triggered by the very thought of being nude is examined. The more obvious explanation of the link between nudity and sex is suggested, but they probe deeper into this question.

The question of why humans, of all the primates, have lost their fur is investigated. Obviously, this involves a degree of

speculation, but there are some clues that inform the suggested answer.

Evidence from the lowly head louse is examined to give some idea of how long ago humans essentially lost their fur. More about this later. In any event, it is suggested that the forces of natural selection leading to greater reproductive success is the probable cause for the "naked ape."

The same genetic studies of lice are also used to deduce when humans

started wearing clothing. Based on research available when the documentary was made, they suggest clothing began

Nudity has nothing to do with humans cheating on their partners, nor does clothing stop them. being worn about 650,000 years ago and that body fur was lost about 3 million years ago. So, a long time elapsed between losing our fur and developing clothing.

Just why nudity has become taboo so widely is speculated on. One psychologist suggests that nudity is a threat to our social contract. Humans live in close social contact and the naked body is a constant source of temptation to cheat on our partner. Flaunting nudity can send out a dangerous message. With nudity the person exposes their body, their person, and their sexual selves. It presents an opportunity for sexual behavior outside the principal union.

He believes shame of nudity serves the beneficial purpose of encouraging faithfulness to our partner, and to share in the rearing of our children.

However, this speculation seems to be contradicted by the lead investigator. He notes that toward the end of the experiment, the participants appeared to have become habituated to nudity; they were more relaxed as they came to know each other. They became more comfortable and congenial.

A number of the participants commented on the degree of comfort they had begun to experience around other volunteers. One participant stated that he had begun to not notice the nudity. The investigator noted that attitudes and inhibitions about nudity had changed within the space of forty eight hours.

The narrator noted that we are not born with sexual modesty, so humans are free to shift the boundaries of what's acceptable and what's not and as long as everyone agrees we are free to create new rules and avoid offense... "just like at a nudist camp."

Over all I would say this is a documentary worth watching. However, the shop worn phrase, "nudity is linked to sex," bears some further discussion. Fortunately, the researchers didn't stop with this explanation. Certainly in most contemporary cultures nudity and sex have a strong linkage, but that's because that's about the only context in which nudity is presented in the experience of most people.

We could rank cultures on dress norms from total female cover other than the hands in some Islamic societies, to total male and female undress as in numerous tribes of Indians in South America. Historically, there have been many other examples of people living in near or totally nudity.

What are we to make of these extremes? We are not justified in saying that these widely varying codes for dress implies that those wearing fewer clothes have had no code of propriety when it came to sexual behavior. By making this factual observation we are recognizing that the assumption that there is an absolute link between nudity and sex is not an objective fact.

All societies stipulate approved behavior and dress to safeguard the integrity of the society and foster child rearing. The fact is the amount of clothing worn is a radically shifting variable. It is an illusion to believe clothing enforces any code of morality or prevents behaviors violating established norms. Interestingly, most people in clothing compulsive societies unquestioningly believe this illusion. What would cause this superficiality to be so tenaciously held?

Human behavior is pretty consistent in all places and times. Adultery and rape are found in all societies. Sexual lust is found everywhere and in all ages. Moral codes in all ages have sought to control, perhaps even abolish these behaviors that have the potential to upset stability. The tools of coercion and shame have been used mightily. Yet, the behaviors persist.

Let's face it. Humans are a perverse lot. From time to time we are going to do what we are going to do. No moral code and no amount of clothing will change that.

The documentary chose a curious word in its discussion of nudity. The word is "flaunting." What defines flaunting?

It could be argued that the test subjects were flaunting their nudity. Certainly critics of any nudity could make that charge. Nudity in a mixed gender context other than between marriage partners would match their definition of "flaunting" behavior.

Curiously, the researchers do not seem to view their test subjects as "flaunting" their nudity. However, the last challenge given was to see who would go into the open street nude to a waiting car in full view of passersby. That seems to match the definition of flaunting nudity to me. It's amazing how even trained professionals can be oblivious to the meaning of what they are doing after offering a dire warning about the negative consequences of "flaunting nudity."

There's another questionable statement by a psychologist who opines that nudity is dangerous and presents the opportunity for sexual behavior outside the primary sexual relationship. On the surface this sounds learned, thoughtful and reasonable.

However, this opinion is no more substantial than the time honored custom of the chaperone always on hand to guard the purity of the virgin while she is being courted despite both parties being dressed to the hilt. Nor does the equally time honored belief that women are so sexually potent and seductive that no man could control himself in their presence have any merit. The truth is nudity has nothing to do with humans cheating on their partners, nor does clothing stop them. To believe otherwise is a nonsense belief that can only be answered with a highly skeptical, hmmm.

The evidence is staring the researchers in the face. They take note of it, saying that exposure to nudity alters perceptions and inhibitions and humans are free to mutually agree to change boundaries – just like at a nudist camp. Yet, they don't say that all the angst and furor over nudity by most societies is much ado about nothing – that nudity does NOT indissolubly equate to sex.

Sexual behavior is highly consequential and loaded with meaning. As such, cultures regulate it, each in its own way. Naturists do so by stressing family oriented social nudity. Naturists say there is no strict link between nudity and sex and this is unambiguously born out in numerous cultures. The difficulty naturist's face is in overcoming the huge emotional investment our culture places in making nudity a direct equivalent with sex, and therefore taboo.

Quite frankly, the problem isn't nudity. Rather, the problem is our beliefs about nudity. [Ed.]
