Compost Bin Open For Business

Our compost bin has been set up at the North end of the parking lot and is available to accept materials for composting. We will post a complete list of acceptable and unacceptable materials for composting. Meanwhile, the following can act as a guide.

Acceptable items for composting:

Lawn clippings Hay-Straw / Bedding from guinea pig or hamster cages Fruit-Vegetable peels or rinds Tea bags-Coffee grounds and filters Egg shells Leaves House plants Manure from Horses, Cows or Poultry Saw dust (wood must NOT be chemically treated

Not Acceptable:

Dog or Cat poop Human waste Chemically treated wood products Dairy Products Bones-Meat-Fat Vegetable scraps that have been cooked in grease or oil Chemicals, solvents, detergents, cleaners Weeds or diseased plants

This is a general guideline. A combination of acceptable materials will insure best results.

If you are unsure of materials you might have to add to the compost, DO NOT add these materials until you have checked with care-taker, Webb or myself.

The compost pile may not look that impressive now, but we will be enlarging it to accommodate more material. Please bring your own (and your neighbor's) grass clippings, etc. and add them to the pile.

We need a chipper/shredder to grind up tree branches occasionally. If anyone has one they can donate or loan, it would be a big help. Also, if anyone has a pitch fork or 2 they are willing to donate, that will make working with the compost pile much easier.

If anyone doubts the need to educate people about the importance of our educational mission, a reading of almost any newspaper is an eye-opener. The Modesto [CA] Bee recently ran an article illustrating the extent or censorship in our schools. As always, it is done "for the children" and is therefore justifiable.

Paper Prints Guide To Nude Beaches

Given the times we live in, with war, the economy, and all the stresses of daily life nipping at our heels, it's nice to know Californians enjoy a mostly free resource for relaxation and clearing their minds: clothing-optional beaches.

Of course, life isn't always a nude beach. Luckily, there are also clothing-optional lakes, ponds, waterfalls, swimming holes, pools, hot springs, and even a meadow. Still not satisfied? More than 100 nude runners took part in the Bare to Breakers faction of San Francisco's Bay to Breakers May 18 (see www.baretobreakers.com). And on moonlit nights, East Bay resident Tom leads nude hikes of up to 10 people high in the hills, usually on East Bay Municipal Utility District land. ("You do need hiking permits," he warns.)

The San Francisco Bay Guardian nude beach guide, now in its 29th year, includes five northern California counties and 44 sites in the paper and another five counties and 81 sites online (www.sfbg.com/nudebeaches), including four new spots. In addition, there is a link to 2001's comprehensive list of nude beaches throughout, what the paper calls, "this great naturist-friendly state of ours". When totaled, the Guardian is listing of 281 sites, just in northern California. With this kind of civic attitude, its no wonder they attract tourists from around the world and industry is flourishing.

They even rate the sites: A for places that are large or longestablished and where the crowd is mostly nude, B to ones where fewer than half of the users are nude, C to small or emerging nude areas, and D to spots they recommend readers avoid. They also note new nude listings as well as truly exceptional spots that warrant special recommendation.

Update On Joni's Medical Condition

A former member and frequent visitor to Lake Edun, Joni Heim, has been diagnosed with Leukemia. She will go to Seattle June 16th for a bone marrow transplant. Actually, the procedure is going to be a stem cell transplant (the new bone marrow will form from those cells).

The reason she must go to Seattle for the procedure is that no clinic in Kansas will do it unless the donor is a blood relative. Joni's two sisters and brother were tested and are not compatible (although they are compatible with each other). I believe even her parents were tested without finding a close enough match.

Joni is 40 years old with a 10 year old daughter. The clinic in Seattle has a couple of donors from the national bone marrow donor list that may match Joni. If successful, there is a very strong possibility she will be completely cured. However, if her body rejects the transplant there is no alternative care for her condition.

This procedure, along with around four months of hospitalization and out-patient care (in Seattle, WA.) will cost nearly \$100,000. She just underwent a second round of

chemotherapy last week and is generally doing well and trying to keep her spirits up. If people are interested in donating to the Joni Heim Transplant Fund, they can contact any UMB Bank nationwide. They can also contact the Salina UMB at (785)826-4000.

The Salina Journal just ran an article about another young woman looking for bone marrow donors. They will be having a donation clinic on Saturday, June 7th at the Salina Regional Hospital Penn Campus from 10am to 4pm. The process consists of a few screening questions and having your finger stuck for a blood sample.

I did a little asking around and was given the number for the Heart of America Bone Marrow Donation Center. Anyone interested in being a potential donor can call 1-800-366-6710. While not everyone will be a match for Joni, more people on the nationwide donor list might just save someone's life.
