Challenge Grants Make Dollars Go Further

Our legal defense fund received two challenges which make our tax-deductible donations go further and together, will help make it easy to reach our goals. The first, from Born Nude, will match, dollar for dollar, the first \$100 of

the first ten gifts greater than \$100. So, if you donate \$500, it becomes \$600; if you donate \$200, it increases to \$300.

The second is open-ended. An anonymous donor will make a gift equal to 150% of the average of the five largest pledges received by October 15. So, if we receive five pledges totaling \$5,000, we fleece Mr. Anonymous an additional \$1,500. Best of all, whatever members force Born Nude to contribute counts toward this average.

So, hopefully all Eduners and friends (including YOU) will reach deep into their pockets and make generous, tax-deductible gifts or pledges early so we can maximize the effects of these two generous challenges.

A Personal Tale

Dear Lake Edun,

I noticed as I read in your Bare Facts newsletter, you were asking for stories from members or guests. Well, I will soon be a guest as of 9-25-04, and I wanted to share my story with your staff and other members alike.

I am a 47 year old, who is a child at heart. I have been a nudist ever since I was young at the age of 12-13. At that age, I would deliberately go naked in front of family, just to see what they would say, and of course, I was right, "Get some clothes on." Being brought up in a strong Christian background and a fundamental Baptist church where my father was a leader "deacon", nudity, was "taboo" and modestly was in.

I've always wanted to go naked when I saw the opportunity, whether sleeping nude, or just walking around inside the house. As I got a few years older into my middle teens, which was about 1973, the streaking craze came about, where hundreds of college students from different campuses across the country, would go and run butt naked. I thought, mmm, now that sounds like fun. So, I dared myself to sneak out of my parent's home and literally go naked outside. However, I didn't wander off very in fear of getting caught, or getting locked out (that would be embarrassing and a tough one to explain).

As I got older and graduated from high school, I went on to Bible College in Kansas City. I was in my 20's or early 30's. Now, at a Bible school you would never think that students roamed the hallways butt naked, at least some of the men did. I don't know about the women. In the dormitories, they would dash to and from the shower room, some had a towel and some didn't. I thought alright here is another chance, so, I went naked from my room (down the hallway) to the shower or restroom. I figured if others can do, so can I.

I remember back in the 60's, the hippie movement was going on, ie. Woodstock, etc. and people were running around either half naked or totally in their birthday suits. Being born in 1956, I wasn't too old at that time, but old enough where I can remember a little. I've always heard in the news about streakers at ball games, or other sporting events, and that has always intrigued me. Not that I would be brave enough to do it, but I just liked the idea, and thought it would be fun.

Once I got older and into my 40's, I have my own place, and can go nude all I want. However, I never realized until

I bought a computer, how much nudity was acceptable in acceptable places, that is. Two months ago, I found out about Lake Edun through the news, so I decided to check it out. I have ALWAYS wanted to go to a nudist facility, ie, camp, etc. I thought, why not. I checked out the facility through their web site, www.lakeedun.com.

I saw the pictures they had online, and that looked like Genesis all over again, in the Garden of Eden. I thought, now there is a whole lot of Adam and Eve's walking around enjoying nature. That is definitely for me, I have made arrangements to be there at Lake Edun the weekend of September 25th.

Not only have I found that web site, I also found another site on the web, that encouraged me even more, and that was www.clothesfree.com. The International Naturists Association, INA, I thought WOW, this is cool, an international nudist/naturists association. I read everything I could read, and joined the association. So, now I have a membership card that tells me and others that I belong to a naturists organization.

For the past week, I've been up 'til wee hours in the morning, ie, 2-5 am, cause I am a night owl. Anyway, I live in a private mobile home area, where there is little light. Yep, I went out and around butt naked, with only a pair of sandals. I never felt so FREE, it felt so great. I thought if this feels great I can only imagine what it's going to feel like spending a day or so being totally nude in 60 acres of Lake Edun. My only regret is that I wished I had found out about all of this earlier in my life. I have always wondered what it would have been like to have been raised in a family of nudists or naturists.

The Naturist Society

Many or perhaps all Eduners are familiar with The Naturist Society, or TNS. The most visible contact most of us have with The Naturist Society is through the pages of the Society's quarterly publication, *Nude and Natural*, more commonly known as *N*. Without a doubt, this publication is the premiere naturist/nudist publication in the world. What they do behind the scenes in support of Naturism, however, is even more important.

Two years ago, due to health reasons, Lee Baxandall founder and owner of TNS sold the operation to three highly capable associates. They have carried on the Society's business in the tradition of Lee Baxandall. If you visit Oshkosh, as we did last summer, you can visit the unassuming business offices of TNS on the shores of a local lake.

Lee's activism for his vision of naturism promoted the idea of free-beaches and the right of naturists to use other public lands. Associated with TNS is NAC or Naturist Action Committee. This is the legal arm of TNS that forcefully acts though the courts, state legislatures, county, and city governments to protect naturist's rights. Then there is the Naturist Education Foundation that provides education in support of naturism. Finally, Lee started the TNS Gatherings that annually take place in different regions of the country. All of this is well documented in the pages of *N*.

I can't imagine not wanting to be a part of this great pioneering organization that has done so much for the spread, protection, and respectability of the naturist movement. It was a moment of pride when I received my first membership card from TNS. I was officially a naturist! I can't imagine doing without my subscription to *N*, or without my TNS membership.

An added benefit of being a TNS and Lake Edun member is that when you visit clubs around the country, even those not specifically TNS affiliated, you are welcomed and may receive a discount. My wife and I have made use of this benefit from California to Florida. It's the card! Don't leave home without it!

Public Nudity

Recently, people have shown concern about the fact that women are allowed to roam around topless in the streets of Toronto, and there is no question that some people find public nudity offensive. However, whether people should be offended is debatable; their reaction is often closer to confusion or embarrassment.

The human body deserves to be shown and respected both for its beauty and its so-called "imperfections." In the appropriate places and situations, public nudity can be comfortable, healthy and can ultimately break social barriers, which hinder communication between people.

There are appropriate times and places for anyone who would like to roam around nude. Exposing oneself in the city might not be a good idea. It could lead to sexual harassment or legal consequences. But what is wrong with people expressing themselves at a local park, beach or on their own front lawn?

Anyone who has spent any amount of time in ill-fitting, uncomfortable clothing knows how good it feels when clothing is not being worn. Clothing is, by nature, something foreign to the body. Yet, clothing does have some practical uses. It keeps us warm, protects us when doing dangerous work, satisfies our esthetic sense with color and decoration, to name a few. Clearly, clothes do not exist simply to "hide" our bodies.

Nudity brings a tremendous feeling of freedom. Once you have been swimming nude, you'll never understand why anyone would want to wear clothes in the water. Medical research has shown clothing can be unhealthy in certain situations. For example, evidence supports the hypothesis that wet, clingy swimsuits can constrict the flow of bodily fluids. Eliminate the swimsuit, and you've eliminated that

problem. Furthermore, it is beneficial to mental health to be expressive. In a free society, people should be free to express themselves and do what they want as long as their freedom doesn't impede the freedom of others, endanger them, or remove their fundamental rights.

Nudity breaks a lot of social barriers that hinder communication between people, because there are no Armani suits, gang colors, uniforms, or social trends to define social status. Under present Canadian law, it is not an offence to be nude on an "isolated" beach. Yet, this suggests when nude, a person is no longer fit to be seen, and must be separated from others. Surely, this is a prejudicial point of view.

Nudity also takes away the artificial inhibitions that society has forced upon us when we were born. If you think about it, the parts we cover are arbitrary. We cover the genital area because of its sexual nature. In fact, an equally sexual body part is the lips. Nevertheless, people walk around exposing their lips without causing mass arousal.

Too much emphasis is put on the perfect body by a clothing-obsessed society. Most people know almost no one has a perfect body, and beauty can be found in bodies of all shapes, sizes, colors, and ages – many of them exhibiting life's scars.

Nudity is a means to the goal of body acceptance. When nude, the full beauty of the human body is exposed. With the support of other nudists, each person can develop appreciation for the wonder of their body. People can find release from the tyranny of societies superficial, impossible standards and find wholeness, allowing them to focus their energy on giving the gift of themselves to the world.

People must realize we are all naked underneath our clothes. Whether social nudity can break some of the barriers that separate people or not, it all comes down to this; being nude is comfortable, healthy and most of all, its fun!

From The Mailbag

For some time I've questioned our society's tendency to view nudism as some form of aberrant behavior, but it is only within the last year or so that I've come to see it as a potentially rewarding lifestyle. My wife and I have started to skinny-dip (usually after dark, at Clinton and Perry Lakes) but we're a bit put off by the necessity of having to sneak around to accomplish what is - to us - a healthier and more natural way to swim and experience nature.

So, we've begun to consider trying naturism, and since we live near your property, it seems to be the obvious place to start. However, I have some questions that I haven't been able to find the answer to elsewhere. For one, since we're beginners and a bit shy (social nudity is a big step from lurking around a beach until dark, waiting for everyone to leave and hoping a ranger doesn't show up). Can we start by visiting Lake Edun on a weekday? Is it usually a bit quieter during this time?

Is there any way to visit as a guest to see if this lifestyle suits us? Any recommendations for first-timers?

I'm a health care professional from a small, very conservative town and while I don't feel I should have to justify this sort of thing, that is not being realistic. Does Lake Edun keep memberships private? Do busy-bodies occasionally attempt to obtain member information to "smear" anyone? Again, I know I shouldn't allow the narrow-minded to control my personal agendas, but we are living in a period that encourages the politics of self-destruction.

Finally, I have a question that I don't know how to phrase as delicately as I'd like, so I'll be blunt - how do men handle the occasional erection that I'm sure will happen from time to time? I understand that staring isn't really encouraged at naturist retreats and lewdness isn't tolerated. Anyway, I'd appreciate an honest reply to this question, despite its being somewhat crass. - Thanks, Sean

We're always open & you're always welcome. You must register at the barn. Nudity is required of adults. All of our lists are confidential. Since everyone is nude, busybodies aren't likely to wander in. The "male" problem is very rare. The atmosphere just isn't sexual. You can sit down with a towel on your lap. This time of year a quick dip in the lake would work very well. We need full names and a postal mailing address to send full information.
